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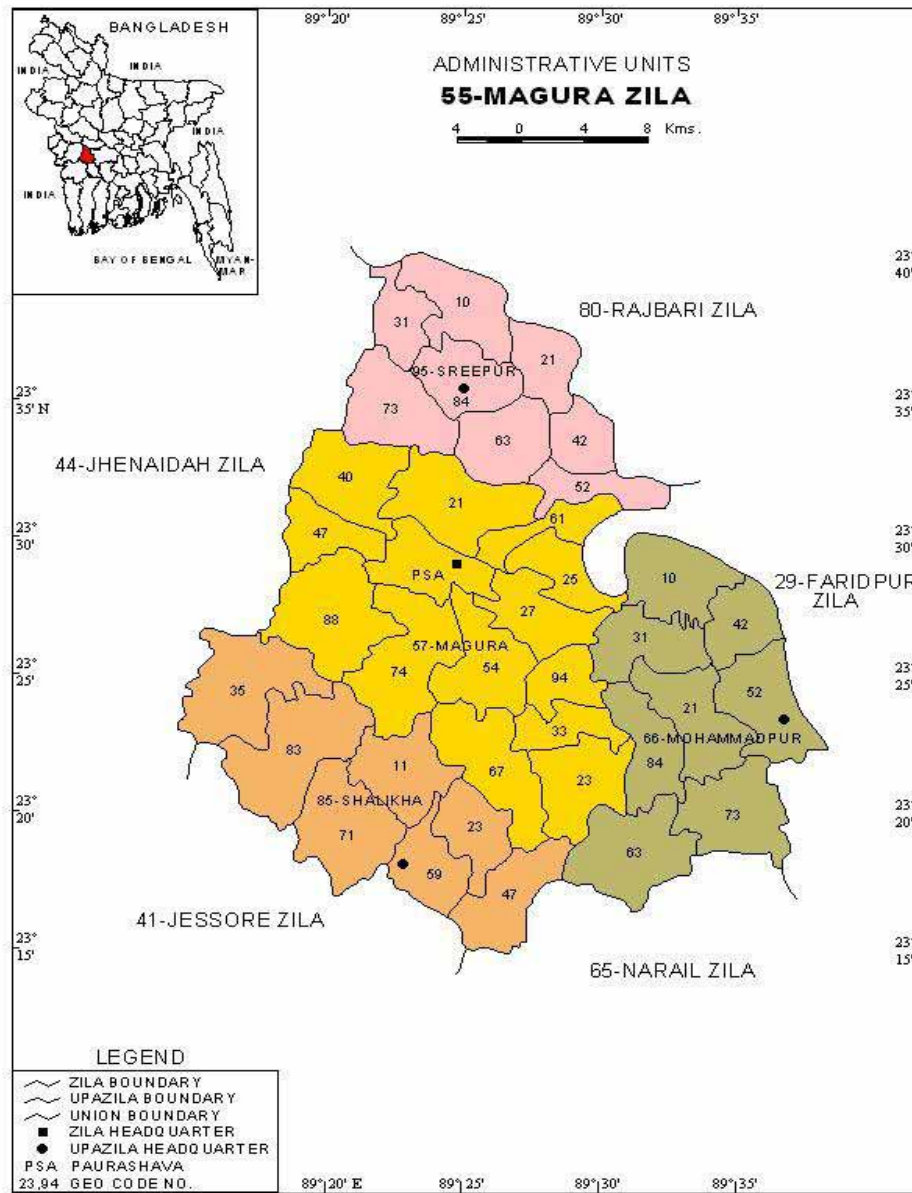
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District Map

CHAPTER 1

Introduction

District at a Glance

Background: Magura district was a sub-division of former Jessore District. Nothing is definitely known about the origin of the district name. It is said that in the long past large number of Maghs who frequently visited in this area for robberies. The people always remained terrified in fear of the robbers. It is believed that the name of the district might have originated from the word **Magh** with some phonetic corruption.

Geographic Area and Location: Magura district is bounded on the North by Rajbari district, on the east by Rajbari and Faridpur districts, on the south by Narail and Jessore districts and on the west by Jhenaidah district. It lies between 23°15' and 23°41' north latitudes and between 89°15' and 89°42' East longitudes. The total area of the district is 1039.10 Sq. km. (401.19 Sq. miles).

Temperature and Rainfall: Annual average temperature varies from maximum 37.1°C to minimum 11.2°C and annual average rainfall is 1467 mm.

Main Rivers: The Gorai, Kumar, Madhumati and Nabaganga are notable rivers of this district.

Administration: Magura sub-division was established in 1945 and was turned into a district in 1984. The district consists of 4 upazilas, 36 unions, 537 mauzas, 700 villages, 1 paurashava, 9 wards and 61 mahallas. The upazilas are Magura Sadar, Sreepur, Mohammadpur and Salikha.

Population: Total population of district is 918419, of them Male are 454739 and Female are 463680. Annual Growth Rate is 1.07.

Literacy Rate: Literacy rate of district is 50.6%, of these male are 62.4% and female are 48.5%.

Archaeological Heritage and Relics: Among the archaeological heritage and relics, Ghat of Nader Chand, Tomb of Pir Mokerram Ali, Tomb of Garib Shah, remnants of the Rajbari of Raja Sitaram Roy, Rajbari of Raja Satrujit Roy, remnants of the Rajbari of Birat Raja at Sreepur, fortification of Debal Raja, Siddheshwari Math at Athara Khada and Ashram of Nangta Baba (Satdoha Ashram) are notable.

Historical Events: Indigo uprising of 1859-60, the remnants of Neelkuthi at Hajrapur, Boro and Amtail. Nahati are marks of extensive indigo cultivation. During the War of Liberation the people of Magura encountered the Pak army in about 16 fronts. In these encounters, many freedom fighters were killed. The heroic role of Lutfunnahar Helena and her tragic death in the hands of the Razakars are proudly remembered by people. 'Akbor Bahini' was very famous for their great contribution during the Liberation War 1971.

Marks of War of Liberation: Magura PTI Compound, WAPDA Canal, Binodpur Bazar, Galakata Bridge (Chhaigharia); Memorial monument-PTI main gate adjacent to the Magura Bishwa Road are Marks of War of Liberation in this district.

Main Crops: Paddy, jute, wheat, oil seed, cotton, sugarcane, chilli, onion, turmeric and varieties of dal (pulse) are main crops of this district.

Main Fruits: Mango, jackfruit, black berry, papaya, wood apple, coconut, palm, date, litchi etc. are main fruits of this district.

Main Export Items: Jute, chilli, onion, betel leaf, vegetables, bamboo etc are main export items of this district.

Economic Situation: The economy of Magura is predominately agricultural. Out of a total of 189,589 holdings of the district 73.95% households are farms that produce varieties of crops namely local and HYV rice, wheat, jute, pulses, spices, cash crops, oilseeds, and others. Various fruits like pineapple, banana, mango, guava, coconut, papaya, palm, lichi, blackberry, dates etc. are also grown in the district. Fish of different varieties are caught from rivers, tributary channels and creeks and even from paddy fields during rainy season. Besides crops, livestock and fishery are the main source of household income.

Non-farm activities also play a significant role in the economy of Magura. The following table 1: shows the total establishments in the urban and rural areas and persons engaged by sex and activity in Magura.

According to the above table, there are 38302 establishments in the district in which 76419 persons are engaged in different types of non-farm activities. Female participation in non-farm activities is very poor. They constitute about 9.8% as against 90.2% of the males. Wholesale & retail trade emerges as the single largest activity (56.7%) with 21690 establishments and 34814 persons engaged (46%) in Magura district.

Flora and Fauna

Flora: Magura is located at mid west part of Bangladesh. Most of the upazilas of the magura district lies within Mature Delta. This area contains a number of ridges of intermediate level land which are the old levees of the Ganges River. The soils are calcareous and sometimes moderately

alkaline. Only the Salikha upazila of the District is a part of Moribund Delta where the soil is sandier.

Many agricultural crops are grown in the district. The three principal crops of Magura district are aman, aus and boro. Aman or winter rice is cultivated in fairly low land where water lies in the rains from one to three feet deep. Aus rice is sown on higher ground than the aman. Boro and wheat are grown mainly with tube well irrigation. Jute and sugarcane are the main cash crops. The principal rabi crops grown are the pulses of various kinds such as masur, gram, khesari, maskali, arhar etc. Of the oil-seeds mustard is most extensively grown. Magura has the largest area under mustard. Sesame and linseed are other kinds of oil-seeds grown. Spices like onions, chilies, dhania, and termaric, etc. are extensively grown in the district.

Homestead groves contain plenty of different kinds of bamboos (*Bambusa bambus*) and fruit trees mango (*Mangifera indica*), black berries (*Syzygium cumini*), jackfruits (*Artocarpus heterophyllus*), banana (*Musa sapientum*), coconut (*Cocos nucifera*), jambura (*Citrus decumana*), papaya (*Carica papaya*), palm (*Borassus flabellifer*), litchi (*Litchi chinensis*), dates (*Phoenix sylvestris*), guava (*Psidium guajava*), jambura (*Citrus decumana*), boro (*Zizyphus mauritiana*), shupari (*Areca catechu*), kamranga (*Averrho karambola*) and tantul (*Tamariandus indica*) grow in the district. Though the cultivation of khejur, palm is in common with Magura district, it is generally abundant in the western half of Jessore and Jhenaidah district. A good variety of flower plants like gandharaj (*Gardenia augusta*), palash (*Butea monosperna*), shimul (*Bombax ceiba*), rajanigandha (*Polianthes tuberosa*), beli (*Jasminum scandens*), hasnahena (*Cestrum nocturnum*), kamini (*Murraya paniculata*), haldekorobi (*Thevetia peruviana*) as different of roses are found all over the district.

Other trees found and homesteads include neem (*Azadirachta indica*), sajna (*Moringa abifera*), sonalu (*Cassia fistula*), lotkan (*Baccaurea ramiflora*) gab (*Diospyros precoloratus*), dumur (*Ficus hispida* sp.), sheora (*Streblus asper*), pitraj (*Aphanamixis polystachia*) palash (*Butea monosperna*), mandar (*Erythrina variegata*), bhadi (*Lannea oromandelica*), debdaru (*Polyalthia longifolia*), mehogini (*swietenia macrophylla*), tamal (*Diospyros Montana*), mendi (*Lawsonia inermis*), sheora (*Streblus asper*), mankanta (*Xeromphis spinosa*) etc.

Common wayside trees comprise kadam (*Anthocephalus cadamba*), katbadam (*Terminalia catappa*), arjun (*Terminalia arjuna*), raintree (*Samanca saman*), nageshwar (*Mesua nagassarium*), bot (*Ficus benghalensis*), ashatha (*Ficus religiosa*), krishnachura (*Delonix regia*), simul (*Bombax ceiba*), palm (*Borassus flabellifer*) etc.

Some trees like hijol (*Barringtonia acutangula*), jarul (*Legerstroemia speciosa*), banyan or bot (*Ficus benghalensis*), babla (*Acacia nilotica*) etc. are also found on the water-edges of the district.

Fauna: There is no natural forest in the Magura district. Whatever thick cover each homestead had in its backyard in the past has been sacrificed to meet the daily need for fuel wood, for construction of houses and agricultural implements and furniture industries. Still today the villages have some sort of orchards, bushes and thickets, which are the habitates for many species of wild animals.

With the indiscriminate felling of many different tree species in the countryside, the number of avi fauna has reduced to a great extent. Various kinds of wild birds have increased its beauty. A good number of birds of different colour, size and habits are found here. Teasing birds like crow (*Corvus splendens*) and kite (*Sterna aurantia*) are found in good number. Game birds namely dove (*Streptopelia orientalis*), pigeon (*Rock pigeon columba livia*), heron (*Ardeola grayii*), pancowri (*Phalacrocorac niger*) are found all over the district. However the birds that still exist in the area comprise bara sada bok (*Ardea alba*), korchey bok (*Ardeola grayii*), choto bok (*Egretta garzetta*), dahuk (*Amaurornis phoenicurus*), bharat pakhi (*Mirafra assamica*), cuckool (*Cuculus micropterus*), bulbuli (*Picnonotus cafer*), doyel (*Copsychus saularis*) are found all over the district. Song birds like cuckoo (*Cuculus micropterus*), shyama (*Copsychus malabaricus*), koyel (*Eudynamis scolopacea*), mayna (*Gracula religiosa autra*) and nightingale are found in different season. The cuckoo the most popular song birds comes to our country. Many migratory birds come from abroad during autum and winter at the beginning of spring. Hen (*Gallus SPP*), duck (*Cairina sentulata*), pigeon (*Rock pigeon columba livia*), are the domestic birds found almost in every household of the district.

A large variety indigenous fishes including carps and many smaller species are available in the district. In the fresh water the popular species are ruhi (*Labeo rohita*), kalbaush (*Labeo calbaso*), boal (*Wallagonia attu*), airh (*Mystas aor*), chital (*Notopterus chitala*) etc. Smaller fishes include sarp (*Puntius sarana*), pabda (*Ompok pabda*), koi (*Anabas testudineus*), magur (*Clarias batrachus*), shing (*Heteropneustes fossilis*), sholl (*Ophicephalus striatus*), chapila (*Gudusia chapra*) etc.

The greater Jessore is one of the most snake-infested areas. The snakes that are usually found here are ghargini shap (*lycodonjara*), mete shap (*Micropisthodon plumbicolor*), cobras (*Naja naja*) of various types, panak and king cobra prefer high lands, paina shap (*Enhydris enhydris*), jait shap (*Naja kauthia*), kali kaitta (*Hardella thurzii*), kori kaitta (*Kachuga tecta*), etc. Darash (*Ptyas mucous*) and shankhur are also commonly found. Guishap (*Varanus salvator*) eat away the eggs laid by snakes and mongoose fight and kill them.

The most common amphibians are bang (*Bufo melanostictus*), jhijhi bang (*Rana limnocharis*), kotkoti bang (*Rana cyanophlyctis*), bhawa bang (*Rana tigerina*) etc.

Concepts and Definitions

1. Population and Housing Census 2011

The population and housing census is the unique source of reliable and comprehensive data about the size of the population of the country, major socio-economic and socio-demographic characteristics.

It is the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing or otherwise disseminating demographic, economic and social data pertaining, at a specified time, to all persons in a country. The essential features of a population census are individual enumeration, universality within a defined territory, simultaneity and defined periodicity.

The population and housing census provides information on the geographic and administrative distribution of the population and household in addition to the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of all the people in the country. The data from the census are classified, tabulated and disseminated so that political leaders, election officials, planners, national organizations including NGOs and civil society, regional and international organizations can use the data in decision-making.

The purpose of community report is to disseminate census data by communities (ward/mahalla in urban area and union/mauza/village in rural area). Data on all key variables namely area, household, population by sex and age group, ethnic population, literacy rate, marital status, school attendance, employment status and religion as well as physical facilities such as source of drinking water, sanitation, electricity and dwelling units have been presented in this report. The planners, researchers and policy makers as well as development partners and community administrators will find this report as a valuable reference for use in advising plans and programs for advancing welfare and well-being of the common people, in particular and the community in general.

Household

Persons, either related or unrelated, living together and taking food from the same kitchen constitute a household. A single person living and eating alone forms one-person household.

Literacy

It denotes ability to write a letter in any language. Literacy status assessment is made for population 7 years and over.

Community

It refers to the following five lower geographic, administrative or revenue units:

- i) **Union:** Smallest administrative rural geographic unit comprising of mauzas and villages and having union parishad institution.
- ii) **Mauza :** Mauza is the lowest administrative unit having a separate jurisdiction list number (J.L. No.) in revenue records. Every mauza has its well-demarcated cadastral map. Mauza should be distinguished from local village since a mauza may consist of one or more villages.
- iii) **Village:** Lowest rural geographic unit either equivalent to a mauza or part of a mauza.
- iv) **Ward:** Smallest administrative urban geographic unit comprising of mahallas and having ward council institution.
- v) **Mahalla:** Lowest urban geographic unit having identifiable boundaries.

Urban Area

It corresponds with area developed around a central place having such amenities as metalled roads, improved communication, electricity, gas, water supply, sewerage, sanitation and also having comparatively higher density of population with majority population in non-agricultural occupations.

i) City Corporation: It includes city corporation area declared by the Ministry of Local Government.

ii) Paurashava/Municipality Area: It includes paurashavas incorporated and administered by local government under Paurashava Ordinance, 1977.

2. Agriculture Census year and reference period

The census year extends over twelve consecutive months having for different census items the different reference periods or days of data collections. Some items have a year or week reference period. Some others have a specific reference day.

The census year covered twelve months from 1 Baishak to 30 Choitra, 1414 Bangla Shal (BS). The year was the reference period for such census items as operated land use, crops, agriculture employment, livestock & poultry deaths and agriculture loan. A single reference day was used for items like holdings, farm size, land tenure, farm population, livestock & poultry inventories and agriculture implements.

The different census items by their reference periods or days are shown below:

Agriculture holding

An agriculture holding is a techno-economic unit of agricultural production under single management comprising all livestock kept and all land used wholly or partly for agricultural production purposes without regard to title, legal form or size. Single management may be exercised by either an individual holder or jointly by two or more individuals or holders or by a judicial person such as a corporation, co-operative or government agency. A holding may consist of one or more parcels (fragments of land) located in one or more areas or mauzas or in more than one administrative unit or division provided that all separate parcels of fragments form parts of same technical unit under operational control of same management.

The definition covers practically all holdings/households engaged in agricultural production of both crops and livestock. Some agriculture holdings may have no significant agricultural land, e.g. holdings keeping livestock, poultry and hatcheries for which land is not an indispensable input for production.

Farm holding

A farm holding is defined as being an agricultural production unit having cultivated land equal to or more than 0.05 acres. Farm holdings are classified into following three broad groups:

- (a) **small:** Farm holdings having minimum cultivated land 0.05 acre but operated land more than this minimum but upto 2.49 acres.
- (b) **medium:** Farm holdings having operated land in between 2.50 to 7.49 acres.
- (c) **large:** Farm holdings having operated land 7.50 acres and above.

Small cultivated land 0.04 acre or less is generally used for kitchen garden growing mainly vegetables. Often seeds of white gourd, water gourd, pumpkin and other strains are sown on households; but these creepers spread out around house roofs and other structures. As such, the minimum cultivated land considered for qualifying to be a farm holding is 0.05 acres.

Non-farm holdings

A non-farm holding is defined as being the one which has neither cultivated nor operated land or has cultivated land less than 0.05 acre.

Tenancy

Owner holdings are those having and operating their owned land and who may or may not be leasing out land.

Tenant holdings are those having no owned land but operating land taken from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Owner-cum-tenant holdings are those having owned land and who may or may not be leasing out their own land to others and who may be taking land from others on share cropping basis or on other terms.

Agriculture work

Agriculture work signifies all activities of holder and his/her labour force doing planning, management, and operation of a holding. It includes land preparation, sowing, weeding, harvesting, feeding and tending livestock & poultry, kitchen gardening, supervising agricultural workers, keeping farm records & accounts, preparing agriculture products for marketing (including packaging), repairing farm equipment, constructing farm buildings & fences, and engaging in land reclamation and improvement and other related activities. It excludes home and other family domestic chores.

Area under pond

The pond area remains under water almost through out the year. Normally, households use pond water for various domestic and sometimes agriculture purposes. Ponds are also generally used for fish culture.

In the census the pond area data were collected separately for both single ownership and joint ownership of households.

Area under temporary crops

It is the land area planted to crops having growing cycle or length of life less than one year. These are the temporary crops such as paddy, wheat, jute, cotton, tobacco, sugarcane, pulses, oil seeds, potato, vegetables and other seasonal crops. A list of temporary crops for which data were collected separately was given in back page of "Tally Sheet". The minimum area recorded for a temporary crop was 0.01 acre. Area under temporary crops and temporary-crops net area are equivalents.

Area under permanent crops

It is the land area planted to crops which remain standing for a long period of time and do not need to be replanted after a seasonal harvest. Mango, jackfruit, coconut, guava, lemon, and other fruit varieties are all permanent crops.

Current fallow

It is land brought into cultivation but left out uncultivated in census year for fertility regaining and improvement or for other reasons.

Net cultivated area

This is land area actually cropped during the census year regardless of number of crops grown plus current fallow. It includes areas under temporary and permanent crops and also current fallow.

Permanent fallow

It is land not available for cultivation due to coming into residence and commercial & other uses. Play ground, graveyard, wild shrubs and jungles, marshy land, and the like fall in this category.

Irrigated area

This is area of total land brought under irrigation coverage for growing crops with irrigations done through mechanical or manual means. Irrigated area classifications fall into two categories: (1) surface water irrigation with main water sources being rivers, canals, beels, ponds, and other water bodies; and (2) underground water irrigation with water lifted by shallow tube-wells, deep tube-wells, and country traditional devices. The irrigation equipments are run by electricity, diesel or petrol, or manual labour.

Cattle and Buffalo

Cattle and buffalo heads owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Goats and Sheep

Goats and sheep owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Fowls, Ducks and Pigeons

Fowls, ducks and pigeons owned by households on day of enumeration were counted.

Temporary crops gross area

Areas aggregated for all temporary crops grown in the census year have made **temporary crops gross area** greater than **temporary crops net area** since the latter has within it the same land cropped more than once in different seasons of a year.

Intensity of cropping

It is percentage of temporary crops gross area in comparison with temporary crops net area. It is expressed as follows:

$$\text{Intensity of cropping} = \frac{\text{Temporary crops gross area}}{\text{Temporary crops net area}} \times 100$$

Cereals

Main cereals are rice and then wheat. Other cereals are jab, barley, cheena, maize, kaun, bajra and joar.

Pulses

Main and common pulses are gram, mung, lentil, arhar, gari kalai, khesari and pea.

Oil seeds

Main oil seeds are rape and mustard, sesamum, linseed, groundnut, soybean, sunflower and castor.

Vegetables

Farmers grow both summer and winter vegetables. Main vegetables are potato, brinjal, raddish, arum, lady's finger, cauliflower, cabbage, bean, tomato, patal, gourd, cucumber, pumpkin, knoll-kal-turnip, dhundal, barbati, khirai, chichinga, carrot, kakrol and sak.

Cash crop

Main cash crops are jute, mesta, sunhemp, cotton, sugarcane and tobacco.

Spices

The main spices include turmeric, ginger, chillies, onion, garlic, corriander, black cumin and ani seed.

Fuel crops

Dhaincha and other smaller plants used as cooking-fue
